SETTING LIMITS FOR TV and computer time can be a parent's biggest challenge. With the BOB ScreenTime Controller from Hopscotch Technology it's just a matter of negotiation. BOB is a strict enforcer managing up to six users, blocking use by the day or week plus certain times of day (homework time, for instance).

BY NOW YOU'RE SAVVY TO Internet threats to your children and have taken steps to safeguard them on the home computer. But how about the one they carry in their pocket? Today's cell phones can access virtually anything that's available on the Internet including ID thieves, child predators and cyber bullies.

RADARSM, a mobile watchdog from eAgency, Inc. instantly notifies parents by sending an alert when an unknown or suspicious call, email or text message is received on their child's phone. They also have a website where parents can view a log of unusual activities and decide if action is needed. 3 WHERE'D I PUT MY KID?

IF YOU'RE MORE concerned with where your child is than who they're talking to, Guardian Angel Technology offers cell phones that transmit a built-in GPS signal you can track on their website. In most situations you can pinpoint the location of the phone within a few feet, either on a Google map or a satellite photo. They even tell you how fast the device is moving in case you want to know if your teenage driver has a lead foot.
